

Our Story

The Pennsylvania Theatre of Performing Arts was founded as Hazleton's non-profit community theater and presented its first performance, a Broadway revue, at the Hazleton Area High School in 1997. Shortly thereafter, the theater troupe moved into an old church on Laurel Street and began offering dinner theater several times a year. In 2006, the organization sold that building and took up residence at the J. J. Ferrara Center on Broad Street in downtown Hazleton. Since that time, PTPA has presented eight to twelve musicals, comedies, dramas, and children's shows per year. In 2010, the organization bought the Ferrara Center from the Hazleton Philharmonic Society and continues in its mission to provide quality theatrical productions for local audiences and theater education for children and adults in the area.

Word of the theater's entertaining and successful productions has brought in new audiences from all over Northeastern Pennsylvania and has increased attendance even in this difficult economy. PTPA has received dozens of Northeast Pennsylvania Theatrical Alliance awards for directing, acting, music, and technical arts over the past several years.

In addition to offering a variety of performances, PTPA holds free or very inexpensive three-month children's theater workshops twice a year which culminate in performances on the Ferrara Center stage. The theater troupe also offers a day and residential camp for children and teens each summer.
